### **Purpose of the Virginia Bass Chapter Federation**



## Presidents Corner Scott Whitmore

It's that time of the year we have been waiting for! Tournament season is upon us and the good news is with the latest relaxation on COVID restrictions we are on track to hold all tournaments as scheduled. With that said, we kicked off the season on March 27<sup>th</sup> with 55 boats competing in the South Regional on Kerr. This was an increase of 22 boats over last year's South Regional. From this tournament we qualified the top six Anglers and Co-anglers for the TBF National Semi-Final on Sutton Lake in West Virginia this coming September. Next the Trail moves west for the West Regional on South Holston on April 17<sup>th</sup>. Note: Tournament site has changed from Ob Knob to Washington County Park. This tournament also will host the Virginia SAF State Championship. For all the Anglers that live on the central and east portions of the state this lake is one of the best smallmouth fisheries in the state and should produce 20+lb stringers of smallmouth. From there we head north for the North Regional on Lake Anna on May 1<sup>st</sup>. At this tournament we will also be hosting as requested by TBF the MD, DE and NJ SAF State Championship. After that we wrap up the Regional's as we head east for the East Regional on the Chickahominy River on May 15 which will also be the Virginia Junior Angler State Championship. After that we culminate our tournament season with the State Championship on the Chickahominy River the Weekend of June 18-20<sup>th</sup>. From those tournaments the top 10% and the top two members from each club (top four if the club has 20+ members) comprise our National Semi-Final Team. If we can send 40+ boats to the National Semi-Final we will qualify the top two Boaters and top two Co-anglers for the National Championship which can be a life changing event for the eventual winner. This state has been well represented in the past with our anglers advancing to BFL All American and then the pro circuit of their choice.

Some more very encouraging news is we continue to grow. Over the last month new memberships have been popping up almost daily. We have had two new clubs sign up recently with the addition of Bass Bandits of Virginia in Region 8 and Battlefield Anglers in Region 1. As I mentioned back in January please keep promoting our new Team Tournament Trail as that is what is helping us grow.

The Board and Members continue to work hard securing new sponsors. Just in the past two weeks we have added Anglers Choice Marine and EL Arriero Mexican Restaurant and currently have several others in the works. We have also secured Yamaha Oil back as a sponsor and should have their product on hand for raffle prizes and purchase in the very near future. I have also received the Humminbird and Minn Kota VIP discounts. For this year they are on a first come first serve basis. I expect to receive the Lowrance VIP discounts on the coming weeks. If you want a discount you will need to email me your request. I ask that you continue to look at Tightlines and take notice of all our sponsors and when you patronize them be sure to let them know you are and Federation member and thank them for their support. They are the reason that we can keep this Tournament Trail a 100% payback event.

In closing I want to thank every member of our Federation for your support and sportsmanship throughout the year. I want to personally thank my Staff. These guys and gals are at the tournament site setting up before most of the Anglers have awaken for the day. When you pass one of these individuals take a second to thank them for their efforts. Without them we would be running the successful Tournament Trail that we are.

The 2021 Virginia Bass Chapter Federations Team Tournament Trail kicked off with its first stop, The South Regional, at Kerr Lake on March 27<sup>th</sup>. Many anglers had reported that the bass were biting well earlier in the week but as tournament day approached the bite was becoming more difficult. One hundred-ten anglers (55 boats) launched from the North Bend Special Events Area at safe-light with the first flight of anglers returning at 3:30 PM for weigh-in. Tournament weights were lower than expected as anglers found the waters stained to muddy and difficult to locate the larger fish that are usually cooperative this time of year. However, the majority of teams still managed to bring a five fish limit to the scales.

The Nasa Langley Bassmasters team of Tyler Caldwell and Ben Fisher finished on top of the leader board with a limit of bass weighing in at 15.10 pounds. Ben also weighed the tournament biggest bass, a 4.57 pound largemouth. Not far behind in second place was the team of Terry Johns and Daniel Eubank from the Blackwater River Bass Club with 14.84 pounds. In third, from Star City Bassmasters were Mitchell and Kevin Camden with a limit of bass weighing in at 14.60 pounds. Just a half a pound back in fourth place with 14:10 pound was the RVA Bassmasters team of Frank Harris and Connor Harrison. Rounding off the Top 5 teams was Sandy River Bass Masters, Kaleb Bowles and Branden Wood with five fish weighing in at 13.92 pounds.

As the Team Trail South Regional Tournament Champions, Tyler Caldwell and Ben Fisher receive free entry into the Virginia State Championship Team Tournament to be held on the Chickahominy River on 19-20 June. Tyler and Ben also earn a spot on the Virginia Bass Chapter Federations State Team with paid entry into the TBF District 12 National Semi Final Tournament on Sutton Lake, WV in September.

The Team Tournament Trail consists of four regional one day events which all lead up to the State Championship Team Tournament scheduled this year for the Chickahominy River June 19<sup>th</sup> and 20th. All anglers that compete in a regional qualifier tournament are eligible to fish in the State Championship Tournament. The team that wins each of the regional tournaments makes the State Team and earns a no entry fee berth into the State Championship. Anglers that compete in multiple regional qualifiers get a discounted entry fee for the State Championship. The top six teams at the State Championship Tournament gain the final 12 positions on the State Team. In each Team Trail tournament season all entry fees are returned to the participants in cash and prizes for a 100% season payout. Additionally, the Team Trail Series serves as the Virginia Bass Chapter Federations qualifying events for the TBF District 12 National Semi Final Tournament. Ten percent of the participants from each of the five events (4 regional gualifiers and the State Championship) earn a berth into the TBF National Semi Final tournament each year.

The Virginia Bass Chapter Federations **"TEAM TOURNAMENT TRAIL**" series serves as the Virginia TBF National Semi-Final (NSF) Qualifiers plus introduces a new **Virginia State Championship Team Tournament**. The series consists of 4 qualifying Team Tournaments held in each of 4 Regions (North, South, East , & West) throughout the state. Each qualifying tournament is a single day event. With this format Virginia TBF Anglers now have an opportunity to compete for bigger payouts and a Virginia State Team Championship while reducing their costs plus the benefit of fishing locally on familiar waters. All four regional tournaments are open to all Virginia TBF members in good standing. Teams that fish any of the 4 Regional events qualify for the 2 Day State Championship Team Tournament. Those teams that participate in 2 or more of the qualifing tournaments earn a berth in the Virginia State Championship Team Tournament at a reduced entry fee. Qualifying tournament winning teams get free entry into the State Championship Team Tournament. The State Championship event has a 100% payback in cash and prizes with a Champions Package awarded to the winning team (cash, awards, apparel, paid TBF National Semi Final entry, etc.).

This is a TEAM TRAIL where anglers complete the registration as a pre-designated team. Launch order is determined by the order in which registrations are received. All Regional Tournaments are single day events. The 2 day State Championship Tournament is only be open to those that fish a qualifying Regional Tournament. Those teams that win a qualifying Regional Tournament will receive free entry into the Championship Tournament. Teams that participate in 2 or more Regional Qualifying Tournaments in a season will have their registration fee reduced for the State Championship Tournament. The winning team from each of the four Regional Tournaments plus the top six teams (6 Anglers & 6 Co-Anglers) from the State Championship Team Tournament will make the NEW "Virginia State Team".

Teams have 3 options available for registration for the 4 Regional qualifying events.

- Teams can download from the State Web Site (<u>www.vabass.com</u>), print, complete the registration, and mail the completed form with a check for payment. This method MUST be postmarked no later than 10 days prior to the event.
- Teams also have the option to complete the registration and pay online through a link available on the State Web site (<u>www.vabass.com</u>). The online registration cutoff is midnight the Wednesday prior to the tournament.
- 3. If Teams do not register in time they may register at the tournament site the morning of the event. There will, however, be a \$25 administrative fee added to the tournament registration fee.

Registrations for the Virginia State Championship Team Tournament will be open by invitation to all qualifying teams.

## Virginia Anglers Compete for National Title on the Red River

Virginia Anglers Chris Fiore from Region 8's RVA Bassmasters and Craig Ferguson from Region 6's Meherrin Bassmasters competed in the TBF National Championship Tournament on the Red River, Shreveport, LA on March 10-13.

Both Anglers earned the opportunity to compete for a national title by fishing their way through their respective Club, Region, and State level tournaments then finishing as the top Virginia Angler or Co-Angler in the TBF District 12 National Semi Final Tournament last fall on Kerr Lake.

Chris and Craig found the fishing a real challenge as record cold temperatures hit the region just days before tournament practice. The keeper size bass proved hard to find and the bite difficult in the backwaters, sloughs, and stump ridden waters of the Red River.



In the Angler Division Chris managed to bring a limit of bass to the scales on Day 1 weighing in at 14.03 pounds and leading the Mid-Atlantic Division going into the final day before the field was cut for the Championship Round. On Day 2 the big bite again proved difficult as Chris put together a limit weighing in at 12.03 pounds falling short of repeating as the Mid Atlantic Division winner and making the final days cut (Chris won the division on Grand Lake in the 2020 Championship Tournament).

Fishing as a Co-Angler presents a whole different dynamic to tournament fishing. It's difficult enough as a Co-Angler on your home waters to win a tournament. On unfamiliar waters it is more difficult as the Co-Angler must adapt each day to wherever his angling partner chooses to fish. Craig met the challenge head on and was able to bring a fish to the scales on the final day.

Both of these Anglers had an experience of a lifetime and were exceptional representatives of the Virginia Bass Chapter Federation. Well Done Gentlemen!

### Ranger Cup Program: NEW for 2021

The New RANGER CUP Program is now Bigger and Better for Ranger Owners. The new nationwide Ranger Cup Program is now open to registered Ranger Owners that compete in any Ranger Sponsored TBF event with 60 Boats or More.

- 1. NEW for 2021: NO MEMBERSHIP FEE
- 2. NO LIMIT ON THE NUMBER OF TIMES YOU CAN WIN
- 3. Anglers MUST meet all Ranger Cup Rules and Guidelines
- 4. Participants MUST own a 2010 or newer Ranger boat and fish from the Ranger all days of tournament
- Eligible Anglers MUST sign up online (<u>www.Rangercup.com</u>) before qualifying for Ranger Cup payout. Program registration expires December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year. That means: Your MUST sign up for 2021 Ranger Cup to be eligible for 2021 Ranger Cup payout.
- 6. Anglers MUST meet the clothing requirements
- 7. MUST display Ranger Cup decal on driver's windshield/console of boat.
- 8. Factory installed Ranger decals MUST be on qualifying boat in the appropriate position. If the boat is wrapped they MUST be put back in the same position and be visible.

#### **Clothing Guidelines**

#### **General Clothing**

- Wear an approved Ranger shirt from take-offs through weigh-ins during all days of qualifying tournaments.
- The Ranger Boats logo must be at least four inches in length on the upper left\* side of the shirt. There can be no logos higher than the Ranger logo.
- The Ranger logo must span at least 10 inches on the back of the shirt and be exclusive boat logo.
- The Ranger Cup logo must be displayed on either sleeve of the shirt.

#### Pro-staff

- Wear Pro-Staff tournament shirt from take-offs through weigh-ins during all days of qualifying tournaments.
- The Ranger Cup logo must be displayed on either sleeve of the shirt.

#### PAYOUT\*

- All other approved events with 60 or more boats (see website for complete list):
  - \$7,000 to win an event, if fishing from a 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021 year model Ranger boat with a 200 horsepower engine or larger.
  - If winner does not meet qualifying guidelines and a qualifying angler finishes in the top 10, then they will be eligible for a \$500 highest finisher cash payout.
- If winner has a 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021 year model Ranger boat powered by a 60-175 horsepower engine, then they will be eligible for a \$1,000 cash payout.
- If an angler's boat who wins an approved event is between a 2010-2017 year model, then they will be eligible for a \$500 BPS/Cabela's gift card.

\* At Pro-Am events, payout is to pro angler/boater only.

- 3. MUST fish from the Ranger all days of tournament
- 4. Applies to Ranger Sponsored Federation Tournaments less than 60 boats. Once a tournament reaches 60 boats or more the nationwide Ranger Cup Program applies to the event. You CANNOT get the Ranger / Federation Bonus Program \$\$ for that event.
- 5. Ranger / Federation Bonus Rewards are submitted by the Tournament Officials to TBF following the event. Rewards will then be paid directly to the Ranger owner.

NOTE: This is a Ranger / Federation Program NOT Ranger Cup

### **MLF "Competitor Level" Membership Upgrade:**

Anglers TBF annual membership includes the "subscriber level" MLF membership. The "Competitor Level" membership is required to fish in any MLF series. Any angler that wishes to compete for the opportunity to advance beyond the TBF National Championship to an MLF Tournament series <u>MUST</u> upgrade their membership level to the "Competitor Level" <u>PRIOR</u> to fishing the TBF National Semi Final Tournament each year. TBF members receive a discounted rate of \$48.75 for the membership upgrade.

## Conservation Director John Flicek

The Alabama Bass containment efforts continue as we are now distributing the educational brochures and sampling packets throughout the State. It was recently discovered that this invasive species of spotted bass have found their way into the New River where it has the potential to start impacting our smallmouth fisheries. Alabama Bass have also turned up in the James River near Richmond's Old Tredegar Iron works. Anglers are asked to report all suspected Alabama Bass catches from any body of water other than the Claytor Lake, Diascunds Reservoir and Lake Gaston. The VA DWR Fisheries Management Team has put together a rapid response group that will investigate reported catches in an attempt to measure the extent of the Alabama Bass movement and make recommendations for future actions necessary to contain their spread.

What is an Alabama Bass? Alabama bass (*Micropetrus henshallii*), aka Coosa spotted bass, are a recent and illegal introduction to Virginia waters. Alabama bass are native to Georgia and Alabama, occurring primarily in large river systems and large impoundments, but are an invasive species here in Virginia. Alabama bass out-compete largemouth bass and readily hybridize with smallmouth and native Kentucky spotted bass.

The Virginia DWR has enacted new regulations that took effect on 1 January 2020, concerning the movement, size, and creel limits of Spotted Bass throughout the state. A copy of the 2021 Virginia Boating and Fishing Regulations are available at most marine and fishing retail locations or online at: <u>https://dwr.virginia.gov/fishing/regulations/</u>.

**No size or possession limits statewide, on spotted and Alabama bass**, except South Holston Reservoir, which has a 15 spotted bass possession limit. Anglers are encouraged to harvest all spotted bass caught.

The Alabama Bass Invasive Species effort is supported through a Conservation Grant from the Bass Fishing Hall of Fame (BFHOF) and a partnership with Virginia DWR, the Virginia Bass Chapter Federation (TBF), and the BASS Nation of Virginia.

### **Angler Creel Surveys**

Please encourage your Regions and Clubs to take part in the **Angler Creel Survey program**. As Tournament Anglers we have an opportunity to be an active participant preserving and improving the resource we enjoy.

The **Tidal Rivers Tournament Angler Creel Survey** cell phone application is easily downloaded using the "Survey123 for ArcGIS" application. Once familiar, the entire survey can be completed in less than two minutes. As part of our partnership with VA DWR Fisheries in fielding this application, Virginia Bass Chapter Federation Anglers are encouraged to download the application and report their data directly to DWR. To install:

- 1. Install ArcGIS Survey123 app from your app store
- 2. Open it and Click "Continue without signing in" -- MUST BE OPEN BEFORE YOU SCAN IMAGE

### Invasive Species Efforts:

#### What do you need to know?

**ALABAMA BASS:** It is Illegal to stock fish into a public body of water without an authorization from Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources (DWR). Anyone with knowledge of intentional stockings of Alabama Bass or Spotted Bass should contact DWR law enforcement at 800-237-5712 or <u>WildCrime@dwr.virginia.gov</u>. **The Reporting Process** - If you catch a suspected Alabama Bass:

- 1. Take a picture of the fish.
- 2. Clip off a thumbnail-sized portion of one of the pelvic fins (pelvic fins are located on the bottom of the fish, just under the head.)
- 3. Store the fin clip dry in an envelope.
- 4. Email picture to: <u>fisheries@dwr.virginia.gov</u> for verification with name of angler, location caught, date caught, & phone number.
- 5. Mail the fin sample collected to the address provided when requested.

**SNAKEHEADS:** Anglers are reminded that it is illegal to possess a live snakehead in Virginia. Anglers are encouraged to kill and report any snakeheads they encounter. In an effort to track Snakehead migration VA DWR has established a **SNAKEHEAD HOTLINE** that anglers can use to report snakehead fish: **(804-367-2925).** There is also a new, easy-to-use web application for reporting observations (http://dgif-virginia.maps.arcgis.com/home/index.html).

Anglers are required to report snakeheads if caught. Snakeheads <u>must be dead if in possession</u> (contained in live well, cooler, etc.). The DWR asks that all snakeheads be killed if possible. If an angler wishes to keep a legally caught northern snakehead, the fish must be killed to be in possession, and the angler must call the hotline or other VA DWR contact and report the angler's last name, date of catch, location of catch, and size. Kill the fish by:

- 1. removing the head,
- 2. separating the gill arches from the body, or
- 3. removing the internal organs and put it on ice as quickly as possible.


A bill was passed during the 2017 Virginia General Assemble providing for increased penalties for persons illegally moving (stocking) snakeheads. VA Code stipulates a civil penalty of up to \$25,000 per incident for unlawful possession, transfer, or release, etc. of snakeheads (29.1-577).

<u>As responsible sportsmen, our focus should be on protection and preservation of native species.</u> -<u>BE PART OF THE SOLUTION!</u> - Protect our fisheries and help stop the spread of Invasive species.

Invasive species cause negative ecological and/or economic harm.

Anglers who suspect they have captured an Alabama bass should take a picture of the fish, clip
off a thumbnail-sized portion of one of the pelvic fins, and store the fin clip dry in an envelope.
The pelvic fins are located on the bottom of the fish, just under the head. They should then either
contact the Department of Wildlife Resources at: fisheries@dwr.virginia.gov or 804-367-1293.

Greetings TBF members,

I'd like to take this opportunity to introduce myself to the TBF community. I'm the new Tidal Rivers Fisheries Biologist working with Virginia's Department of Wildlife Resources focusing on fisheries research and management in tidal rivers, including the James, Chickahominy, York, Rappahannock, and Piankatank Rivers. Largemouth Bass are a valuable resource in this region so it is only fitting that they will be an important part of upcoming research projects and monitoring efforts.

First and foremost, we will continue Alabama Bass monitoring efforts. DWR has adopted a Rapid Response Plan that allows us to mobilize quickly and sample areas where Alabama Bass have been reported. TBF has been an important partner in spreading awareness about invasive Alabama Bass and distributing sample kits for anglers to collect fin clips for potential genetic testing. Anglers are critical in our efforts to assess the distribution and stop the spread of these invaders. Through prompt reporting, you will help us focus our sampling efforts and prevent Alabama Bass from spreading further.

We are expanding and standardizing our sampling efforts throughout tidal rivers. Biologists will use boat electro-fishing to sample more sites and cover a larger area throughout the tidal James, Chickahominy, Pamunkey, Mattaponi, and Rappahannock Rivers every fall. These expanded sampling efforts will allow us to track trends in Largemouth Bass populations across tidal rivers and assess age, growth, and size distributions in a more timely manner. We are also planning a Largemouth Bass tagging study, beginning this spring. The results of the project will give Biologists an idea of how Bass disperse after translocation. Keep an eye out for Largemouth Bass tagged with red anchor tags. If you catch one, remove the tag and contact DWR with the tag information.

We will continue to keep TBF updated on Alabama Bass spread prevention efforts and DWR projects pertaining to Largemouth Bass. ## TBF Announces NEW Changes to the Junior Angler Program

**NEW FOR 2021!** Young anglers who are in the 8th grade or less on the day of their LAST State Federation Junior Qualifier (The day they qualify) can join as a TBF Junior members and fish as a team with a buddy from their own boats with their own boat captains! TBF has active state Junior Programs in almost every state across the country and 1 team advances to the Junior World Championship for every 10 <u>unique</u> teams that fish any State Federation Junior Program. (so (1) for 1-10, (2) for 20, (3) for 30 etc.) AND NEW FOR 2021 – 1 team advances for every 20 unique teams from any other (non-state federation) TBF sanctioned (by national office) JUNIOR trail. Any junior program must have a minimum of 6 active Junior members to participate.

These junior anglers fish in local club & state tournaments and participate in fundraising and conservation projects just like the adults do.

The competitive branch of this program allows the anglers to attend their sanctioned Junior State events and attempt to qualify for the annual TBF Junior World Championship (JWC) out of their own boat with their own boat captain for thousands of dollars in scholarships and prizes! The bigger your program is the more teams can advance.

# Virginia Youth Anglers Compete at State Federation Region Tournaments

Under the new format for Virginia Youth Anglers, teams are allowed to participate in State Federation Region Tournaments and earn points towards a State Youth Team of the Year Title. Youth Teams enter (no entry fee), launch, and weigh-in with the adults during Region Tournaments. Teams are awarded points based upon the number of Youth teams competing in the event and their finishing place among youth teams. Points for the youth teams from throughout the state will be complied and their top 3 point earning events will be tallied to determine the Virginia Youth Team of the Year. Each year the Youth teams from throughout the state will gather for a tournament and head to head competition to determine who will represent Virginia at the TBF Junior World Championship Tournament.

Virginia High School Angling Teams are also invited to compete at State Federation region Tournaments to earn points towards a Virginia High School Team of the Year title. The High School Anglers also compete in the Student Angler Federation events and the SAF hosted State High School Championship Tournament each year.

Youth Anglers must be a member of an active TBF Junior Club or the Student Angler Federation (SAF). Each Youth Angler Team must arrange for their own boat and boat captain and complete the required Emergency Medical Information Event and Liability/Parental Consent forms. Youth Teams will launch and weigh-in with the host tournament anglers and earn valuable points towards the Virginia TBF Junior Angler State Championship title.





To qualify for the NSF you must finish in the top 10% in one of the State Team Tournament Trail Regional's or the State Team Championship. Additionally, each club can qualify an Angler and a Co-Angler for the NSF each season. The bigger your club, the more Anglers / Co-Anglers you can qualify (6-20 member clubs earn one Angler & one Co-Angler berth; with 20 to 29 clubs members earn 2 Anglers and 2 Co-Anglers berths, etc).

Beginning on March 12<sup>th</sup>, we started our annual Hampton Bass Pro Shops Spring Fishing Classic support. As usual, we manned the Rod & Reel Exchange table at the stores entrance and conducted our Tackle Pack drawing. Discussions with local management concluded that due to COVID related issues we would not hold the Reel Kids Casting Skill Competition that is usually part of their Spring Fishing Classic Activities. We may, however, re-entertain the possibility of holding an event later this summer should conditions allow. 

## Regions 8's "Rods & Reels for Kids"



Thank you to Region 10 bass club for letting us blast off and weigh in with you all.




