#### **Purpose of the Virginia Bass Chapter Federation**





The Virginia Bass Chapter Federations Team Tournament Trail kicked off the 2023 tournament season on Kerr Lake this past October  $20^{\text{th}}$ . This event was the first of four regional tournaments that qualify Virginia Federation anglers to fish the Team Tournament Trail State Championship on Lake Anna on 3 – 4 June 2023. The top ten percent from this tournament also earned a berth in the 2023 District 12 TBF National Semi Final to be held on the Monongahela River in Fairmont, West Virginia next September.

It was a typical cool fall morning as teams arrived at the North Bend Special Events Area for their pretournament check in and on-site registrations. Anglers were released for their day of competition at safelight and began returning to the Special Events Area pier to check-in and for weigh-in at 3:30 PM. Anglers reported that the bite was a bit more difficult than expected for the fall on Kerr Lake as the first touch of cool fall weather spread through the area.

The Black Water Bass Club team of Clay and Jeff Ross took the win with a five fish limit weighing in at 14.72 pounds. Clay and Jeff also weighed the tournaments Big Bass, a 4.10 pound largemouth. This was the second win this year on Kerr Lake for the Ross team as they won the Virginia Team Trail State Championship this past June. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Place team also from the Black Water Bass Club was Nathan Minnix and Tony Campbell with 13.10 pounds. Frank Harris and Stan Cobb from the RVA Bassmasters finished in 3<sup>rd</sup> Place with a five fish limit weighing 11.61 pounds. From the Star City Bassmasters, Chuck and Hayden Hart took the 4<sup>th</sup> spot with 10.24 pounds. Rounding off the Top 5 was the team of Dan Snyder from the Battlefield Anglers of Virginia and Lynn Hoeffer from the NASA-Langley Bassmasters with 9.87 pounds.

As winners of this Team Tournament Trail South Regional event Clay and Jeff Ross receive a No-Entry Fee berth in the Virginia Team Trail State Championship plus, along with the second and third place teams, earned a berth in the 2023 District 12 TBF National Semi Final Tournament.

# Virginia Anglers to Compete for National Title on the Lake of the Ozarks



Virginia Bass Chapter Federation Anglers, Thomas Wooten and Dave McLean along with Co-Anglers, Mike Coleman and Jared Netto will compete for the TBF National Championship on Missouri's Lake of the Ozarks, March 29-31, 2023. These anglers earned their way to the championship tournament as the top 4 Virginia Anglers (2 from the Angler Division and 2 from the Co Angler Division) at the TBF National Semi Final Tournament held on the Chickahominy River this past September.

The Federation National Championship Tournament features the top grassroots boaters and co-anglers from each state and Canada. The TBF National Championship is a "no-entry-fee" tournament with a prize purse of over \$400,000. All fifty-one boaters and fifty-one co-anglers competing in the National Championship will fish the first two days of the event then the field is cut down to the 7 Division Champion boaters and 7 Division Champion co-anglers who will compete on the third and final day for the *Living Your Dream* Prize packages and the National Champion Boater and National Champion Co-Angler titles.

The TBF National Champion Boater and National Champion Co-angler both receive a *Living Your Dream* package. The boater National Champion's prize package is valued in excess of a \$125,000 in cash and prizes including a brand-new Ranger Z520 powered by Mercury 250HP outboard engine, Lowrance Electronics and MinnKota Trolling Motor. PLUS, a significant CASH prize, paid entry fee stipend into whatever tournament circuit they want to fish and much more! The National Champion Co-Angler prize package will be worth over \$30,000, including 20K cash PLUS paid entry stipends into the circuit of choice, and more. The top 14 finalists (Angler & Co Angler Division Champions) will also receive a "Living Your Dream" prize package of various sizes plus those anglers that maintained the optional Competitor Level MLF status advance to the BFL All American Championship.

The Virginia Bass Chapter Federations **"TEAM TOURNAMENT TRAIL"** series serves as the Virginia TBF National Semi-Final (NSF) Qualifiers plus introduces a new **Virginia State Championship Team Tournament**. The series consists of 4 qualifying Team Tournaments held in each of 4 Regions (North, South, East , & West) throughout the state. Each qualifying tournament is a single day event. With this format Virginia TBF Anglers now have an opportunity to compete for bigger payouts and a Virginia State Team Championship while reducing their costs plus the benefit of fishing locally on familiar waters. All four regional tournaments are open to all Virginia TBF members in good standing. Teams that fish any of the 4 Regional events qualify for the 2 Day State Championship Team Tournament. Those teams that participate in 2 or more of the qualifing tournaments earn a berth in the Virginia State Championship Team Tournament at a reduced entry fee. Qualifying tournament winning teams get free entry into the State Championship Team Tournament. The State Championship event has a 100% payback in cash and prizes with a Champions Package awarded to the winning team (cash, awards, apparel, paid TBF National Semi Final entry, etc.).

This is a TEAM TRAIL where anglers complete the registration as a pre-designated team. Launch order is determined by the order in which registrations are received. All Regional Tournaments are single day events. The 2 day State Championship Tournament is only be open to those that fish a qualifying Regional Tournament. Those teams that win a qualifying Regional Tournament will receive free entry into the Championship Tournament. Teams that participate in 2 or more Regional Qualifying Tournaments in a season will have their registration fee reduced for the State Championship Tournament. The winning team from each of the four Regional Tournaments plus the top six teams (6 Anglers & 6 Co-Anglers) from the State Championship Team Tournament will make the NEW "Virginia State Team".

Teams have 3 options available for registration for the 4 Regional qualifying events.

1. Teams can download from the State Web Site (<u>www.vabass.com</u>), print, complete the registration, and mail the completed form with a check for payment. This method MUST be postmarked no later than 10 days prior to the event.

2. Teams also have the option to complete the registration and pay online through a link available on the State Web site (<u>www.vabass.com</u>). The online registration cutoff is midnight the Wednesday prior to the tournament.

3. If Teams do not register in time they may register at the tournament site the morning of the event. There will, however, be a \$25 administrative fee added to the tournament registration fee.

Registrations for the Virginia State Championship Team Tournament will be open by invitation to all qualifying teams.



# **2023 National Semi-Final Tournament**

#### 15-17 September 2023 on the Monongahela River, Fairmont WV

Hosted by the West Virginia Bass Chapter Federation

**Who Qualifies:** Top 10% of each Division (Angler & Co-Angler) from each State Team Tournament Trail event (North Regional, South Regional, East Regional, West Regional & State Championship Team Tournament); Top 10% from each division from each Region Tournament Series event (Anglers qualifying through Region Series Tournaments must have participated in a State Team Trail Tournament each season). A minimum of One Angler & 1 Co-Angler from each club statewide additional Angler/Co-Anglers qualify based on club membership (1-19 members = 1 Angler/ 1 Co-Angler; 20-29 members = 2 Anglers/2 Co-Anglers; 30-39 members = 3 Anglers/3 Co-Anglers; etc.) additional opportunities to qualify for those TBF members serving as Youth Program Tournament Boat Captains.

**Qualified Angler Identification Process:** Anglers who qualified through state tournaments will be identified to TBF by the State Federation. Anglers representing each chapter/club will be identified by 30 June 2023 to the State Federation President. Qualified anglers will complete their State level registration and pay entry fees online through the State Federation. Once all qualified anglers have committed to fish the event and paid the required registration fee, the State will compile the master roster and forward the names to TBF.

**TBF Registration:** TBF will notify qualifiers via Invitation Email and link to their on-line final registration portal. Anglers must indicate acceptance of the email invitation to compete and register. Registration is completed online through TBF by following the email link provided. Once registered all communication will be by the email and/or phone indicated on your TBF membership profile. Registration fees will be paid through the Virginia Bass Chapter Federation web site. Registrations are non-refundable.



The following Contingency Programs are available to Virginia Bass Chapter Federation Members to participate in. Anglers <u>MUST</u> join each program every year and declare your participation prior to each tournament.

#### Ranger Cup Program: NEW

The New RANGER CUP Program is now Bigger and Better for Ranger Owners. The new nationwide Ranger Cup Program is now open to registered Ranger Owners that compete in any Ranger Sponsored TBF event with 60 Boats or More.



- 2. NO LIMIT ON THE NUMBER OF TIMES YOU CAN WIN
- 3. Anglers MUST meet all Ranger Cup Rules and Guidelines
- 4. Participants MUST own a 2011 or newer Ranger boat and fish from the Ranger all days of tournament
- Eligible Anglers MUST sign up online (<u>https://www.rangerboats.com/ranger-cup.html</u>) before qualifying for Ranger Cup payout. Program registration expires December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year. That means: Your MUST sign up for 2023 Ranger Cup to be eligible for 2023 Ranger Cup payout.
- 6. Anglers MUST meet the clothing requirements
- 7. MUST display Ranger Cup decal on driver's windshield/console of boat.
- 8. Factory installed Ranger decals MUST be on qualifying boat in the appropriate position. If the boat is wrapped they MUST be put back in the same position and be visible.

#### **Clothing Guidelines**

#### General Clothing

- Wear an approved Ranger shirt from take-offs through weigh-ins during all days of qualifying tournaments.
- The Ranger Boats logo must be at least four inches in length on the upper left\* side of the shirt. There can be no logos higher than the Ranger logo.
- The Ranger logo must span at least 10 inches on the back of the shirt and be exclusive boat logo.
- The Ranger Cup logo must be displayed on either sleeve of the shirt.

#### Pro-staff

- Wear Pro-Staff tournament shirt from take-offs through weigh-ins during all days of qualifying tournaments.
- The Ranger Cup logo must be displayed on either sleeve of the shirt.

#### PAYOUT\*

- All other approved events with 60 or more boats (see website for complete list):
  - \$7,000 to win an event, if fishing from a 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 year model Ranger boat with a 200 horsepower engine or larger.
  - If winner does not meet qualifying guidelines and a qualifying angler finishes in the top 10, then they will be eligible for a \$500 highest finisher cash payout.
- If winner has a 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 year model Ranger boat powered by a 60-175 horsepower engine, then they will be eligible for a \$1,000 cash payout.
- If an angler's boat who wins an approved event is between a 2011-2018 year models, then they will be eligible for a \$500 BPS/Cabela's gift card.

- 4. Applies to Ranger Sponsored Federation Tournaments less than 60 boats. Once a tournament reaches 60 boats or more the nationwide Ranger Cup Program applies to the event. You CANNOT get the Ranger / Federation Bonus Program \$\$ for that event.
- 5. <u>Ranger / Federation Bonus Rewards are submitted by the Tournament Officials to TBF following the event.</u> Rewards will then be paid directly to the Ranger owner.



A note from the VP

I know and understand that a lot of us go fishing all year long. The spring, summer and fall of the year generally don't cause too many problems. However winter fishing has the potential to be the most hazardous time of the year. When fishing in the winter, don't get caught thinking it won't happen to me, that's when it does. None of us are bulletproof. A failure in preparation can allow a situation to go south in the blink of an eye. It only takes one mistake to get in a life threatening situation and few fishermen get a second chance to redeem themselves.

There are some things that will help and several are imperative when fishing in cold conditions. The easiest thing a fisherman can do is to pay close attention to the weather and not set forth in marginal conditions or conditions that are expected to deteriorate. Fishing is fun, but it just isn't that important. If the conditions aren't good, wait and go later. Once on the water, continue to monitor the weather. Weather comes into the safety equation as it may change rapidly. Our weather can quickly go from calm and sunny with clear blue skies, to howling wind, torrential rain or snow and the temperature falling. Keep an eye on the sky for any signs of changing weather. Carry a VHF or weather radio, or have a weather app on you cell phone and check it regularly. You could be playing with your life as weather situations, mistakes and oversights that would only be uncomfortable during warmer months can quickly escalate to life threatening during the winter.

The water temperature in your favorite lake or river doesn't warm as quickly as the air. There may be some spikes of a couple of degrees, but the water didn't cool quickly in the fall and it won't warm quickly during warm winter.

Layering clothing is the key so it can be removed if the day warms. A base layer that will wick perspiration away from the skin is a must for the first step. Mid layers add to the insulation while affording easy movement. The outer layer completes the deal and it can vary from basic outdoor wear to rain gear or even storm gear.

Always wear your life jacket or PFD whenever the gasoline motor is in operation and keep you kill switch attached. It is also a good idea to wear an inflatable PFD at all times while fishing in the winter months.

Preventive maintenance should be followed at all times, but it becomes especially important during cold weather. Little things that were minor issues in warm weather may prevent needed equipment from working in cold weather. Grease and oil are much thicker and do not flow readily. Cold grease could prevent shifting, throttle and steering cables from moving. Batteries are susceptible to cold too. The battery that started the outboard fine all fall may be weak with the low temperatures of the winter months.

It is especially important to be sure all pumps and thru-hulls are in good working order. Bait well, livewell and bilge pumps are plastic and may freeze, crack and leak. Losing a bait well or livewell pump is aggravating, but a bilge pump that doesn't function is dangerous. A manual bilge pump is an inexpensive investment that quickly pays for itself many times over if needed.

#### VP comments continued:

Checking safety equipment is part of preventive maintenance. Hopefully you never need flares, but they need to work if you do. An orange distress flag or whistle, are wise additions. Check your first aid kit too – just to be sure. It isn't required, but if you're going to carry the box, have all the parts and pieces.

Here's a list of a few things that I like to do to ensure a safe and fun winter bass trip:

ALWAYS carry a change of clothes and a towel. In the event that you do go in, you are going to want to get out of your wet clothes quickly. I don't go crazy with this. Just a pair of thick insulated underwear, wool socks and an extra hat/head covering of some sort will do. If you have extra rain gear, bring it too. After drying off and changing clothes, wear the rain gear to help cut the wind and keep you warm while you make your way back to the ramp. Also, know how you'll get back in the boat. Most boats have built-in ladders. If yours doesn't, you can stand on the cavitation plate on the outboard and trim up the motor to lift you up high enough to crawl onto the back deck.

Prepare a safety kit in a 1-gallon plastic zippered bag with the following items: waterproof matches, gloves, a space blanket, electrical tape and a few tools that will help you make emergency repairs on the water if necessary. It is also a good idea to also carry a jump box or jumper cables and a tow rope.

Let someone know where you will be fishing, when you are planning to return, and who you will be fishing with. Keep your cell phone fully charged and in a dry place so you'll have it if you need to call for help.

Everything's easier and safer in winter if you fish with a friend, so keep that in mind, especially if you're fishing in areas with limited cell service or on ramps that might be hard to access during a winter drawdown – there's no reason to get wet from the start while launching a boat solo at a shallow ramp. You might also want to bring salt, which is really nice to have when it's time to load out at an icy ramp.

I know these emergency items might seem a bit extreme for a day of fishing. However, if you are on a body of water that isn't surrounded with boat docks, but rather forests, these items could really come in handy. There are places on many lakes that don't have cellular service, so a quick phone call for help might not be an option. It only takes a few minutes to pack this stuff and takes up almost no room in the boat. And this is the time of year that it can be very important.

During the winter, the number of fishermen on the water and the odds of flagging someone for assistance is greatly diminished. Fishermen should look out for each other and offer assistance whenever possible.

Take the time to be properly prepared, take care and pay attention, that way you can enjoy catching fish all year, and be as safe as possible

# Conservation Director John Flicek

Anglers are reminded that several new fishing and boating regulations went into effect on January 1<sup>st</sup>. One significant change intended to help curb the spread of invasive species and nuisance plants/organisms are the implementation of **"CLEAN – DRAIN – DRY"** policies. Boaters are now required by law to remove any vegetation from their boat/trailer and drain bilges when removing there vessel from the water. The regulation doesn't require that you immediately drain livewells if you are retaining your catch for weigh-in or harvest. However, unused livewells and baitwells should be drained on site. Regulations also require that reasonable measures should be taken to dry out bilges, livewells and baitwells prior to launching into another body of water. With this in mind, it's always a good practice to rinse your boat and trailer after use and periodically conduct a thorough cleaning your livewells, pumps, and aeration systems. I periodically fill my livewells with a garden hose then add about one half cup of bleach to each livewell, then run my pumps/aeration system for 15 to 20 minutes. I then drain and repeat the process with fresh water. There are some excellent products available that are specifically formulated to clean livewells, one such product is Captain Gary's "Livewell and Cooler Cleaner" (Virginia Bass Chapter Federation Sponsor) and can be ordered online at <u>www.captaingarysproducts.com</u>.

Region 8 members recently re-installed the release pipe following an extensive bank restoration project at James City County's Riverfront Park. The pipe is located at the dedicated tournament weigh-in area (old campsite #109). The weigh-in site is available for all tournament activities and can be reserved through the park office. The cap on the pipe is usually locked and a key is available at the park office when you rent the site. Users are reminded that they MUST pump water from the river to the head of the pipe and have sufficient water flow in the pipe before releasing any fish. All fish should be release one at a time and positioned in the pipe head first. It is recommended that the pipe not be used for fish over 5 pounds. Large should be released manually from the dock area near the ramp.





#### Invasive Species Efforts ---- What do you need to know?

**ALABAMA BASS:** The Alabama Bass Education, Identification, and Containment Project efforts continue with distributing the educational brochures and sampling packets throughout the State. Anglers are

asked to report all suspected Alabama Bass catches from any body of water other than the Claytor Lake, Diascunds Reservoir and Lake Gaston. The VA DWR Fisheries Management Team has put together a rapid response group that will investigate reported catches in an attempt to measure the extent of the Alabama Bass movement and make recommendations for future actions necessary to contain their spread. Anglers are encouraged to harvest all spotted bass caught.

Anglers are reminded that it is Illegal to stock fish into a public body of water without an authorization from Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources (DWR). Anyone with knowledge of intentional stockings of Alabama Bass or Spotted Bass should contact DWR law enforcement at 800-237-5712 or

The Reporting Process - If you catch a suspected Alabama Bass:

1. Take a picture of the fish.

2. Clip off a thumbnail-sized portion of one of the pelvic fins (pelvic fins are located on the bottom of the fish, just under the head.)

3. Store the fin clip dry in an envelope.

4. Email picture to: <u>fisheries@dwr.virginia.gov</u> for verification with name of angler, location caught, date caught, & phone number.

5. Mail the fin sample collected to the address provided when requested.

**NORTHERN SNAKEHEADS:** Anglers are reminded that it is illegal to possess a live snakehead in Virginia. Anglers are encouraged to kill and report any snakeheads they encounter. In an effort to track Snakehead migration VA DWR has established a **SNAKEHEAD HOTLINE** that anglers can use to report snakehead fish: **(804-367-2925).**

#### **Similar-Appearing Native Species**



Anglers are required to report snakeheads if caught. Snakeheads <u>must be dead if in possession</u> (contained in live well, cooler, etc.). The DWR asks that all snakeheads be killed if possible. If an angler wishes to keep a legally caught northern snakehead, the fish must be killed to be in possession, and the angler must call the hotline or other VA DWR contact and report the angler's last name, date of catch, location of catch, and size. Kill the fish by:

- 1. removing the head,
- 2. separating the gill arches from the body, or
- 3. removing the internal organs and put it on ice as quickly as possible.

Greetings TBF Anglers,

Happy holidays and happy New Year! Hopefully, you are getting out there and getting into some of those trophy bass that bite so well during the winter here in Virginia.

One thing that we've been working is to better understand the Virginia angler. Much of this is built off of the comments we receive from groups such as TBF over the year, and we supplement this perspective with the results from our Statewide Angler Survey. You may have received a request to fill this out; if you did, we really appreciate your input. I have asked our Human Dimensions staff (our people who study people) to get bass angler specific results. Here they are:

Largemouth and smallmouth bass are the most popular sport fish in Virginia. Overall, 66% of Virginia anglers list largemouth or smallmouth as their most fished for fish – odds are pretty good that if you run into another fisherman, they are a bass fisherman. Bass fishermen fish an average of 32 days per year in Virginia, and fish a variety of environments – 29% of their time is spent on our large lakes, 26% on smaller lakes, and 35% on river systems. Many bass anglers (58%) fish out of a motorized boat, but a significant portion fish out of a non-motorized boat (44%). Of note is that 12% of Virginia's anglers fished in a tournament in the last year and 10% belong to a national fishing club like TBF.

We're particularly interested in how bass anglers view what we do and we looked at some performance measures from the survey. The numbers I list are on a scale of 1 (very poor) to 5 (very good). Overall, bass anglers rate DWR's performance highest on issues such as providing information on fishing regulation (4.0), providing information on where to fish (3.8), and improving fish habitat (3.7). Our lowest ratings were for working with private landowners to get additional fishing access (3.2), improving existing access (3.5), and stocking warm water fish (3.5). We take these results very seriously. Know that we are working diligently where we can to improve and gain additional access, but improvements are costly and access can be difficult to obtain in many situations. Also, we're very interested in the results of the F1 bass stocking study and if cost effective, will adopt this as one of our ways of managing largemouth bass. We're also working hard to produce smallmouth bass for stocking at the recently renovated Front Royal Fish Hatchery in northern Virginia.

Another important perspective comes with economic impact. The American Sportfishing Association (asafishing.org) puts out a great report that provides detailed information on the value of sportfishing. In Virginia, freshwater fishing supports about \$568 million in economic impact and supports more than 4,000 jobs. While the math isn't exact, it's fair to say that bass anglers support more than \$300 million in economic value to Virginia. It is important for DWR (and you as well!) to understand the economic impact of bass fishing. This factors in front and center as we review our programs for efficiency and determine where to best put the resources that sportsmen contribute through license and tackle purchases.

#### DWR Continued:

The take home message – there are a lot of bass anglers and they have tremendous economic impact in Virginia – and we're trying our best to listen, be transparent, and serve this community. 

# Virginia Youth Anglers Compete at State Federation Region Tournaments

Under the new format for Virginia Youth Anglers, teams are allowed to participate in State Federation Region Tournaments and earn points towards a State Youth Team of the Year Title. Youth Teams enter (no entry fee), launch, and weigh-in with the adults during Region Tournaments. Teams are awarded points based upon the number of Youth teams competing in the event and their finishing place among youth teams. Points for the youth teams from throughout the state will be complied and their top 3 point earning events will be tallied to determine the Virginia Youth Team of the Year. Each year the Youth teams from throughout the state will gather for a tournament and head to head competition to determine who will represent Virginia at the TBF Junior World Championship Tournament.

Virginia High School Angling Teams are also invited to compete at State Federation region Tournaments to earn points towards a Virginia High School Team of the Year title. The High School Anglers also compete in the Student Angler Federation events and the SAF hosted State High School Championship Tournament each year.

Youth Anglers must be a member of an active TBF Junior Club or the Student Angler Federation (SAF). Each Youth Angler Team must arrange for their own boat and boat captain and complete the required Emergency Medical Information Event and Liability/Parental Consent forms. Youth Teams will launch and weigh-in with the host tournament anglers and earn valuable points towards the Virginia TBF Junior Angler or High School State Championship title.



It has been a great addition to our event. The Region 4 fisherman also assisted in weighing the fish. Both contributions really assist in making the event better. The fishing rodeo is named after Tony Huddleston, a former employee of the Christiansburg Parks and Recreation Department. While employed by the department, he was a facility supervisor and official for a variety of youth and adult athletic leagues. 


