The Federation, shall, in its operations, pursue the goals of organizing and conducting competitive fishing events which adequately provide for the needs of the bass and the angler; to establish live release of bass to their habitat as an integral part of sport fishing; promote realistic conservation of natural resources and causing adoption and enforcement of adequate water quality standards; of educating the membership in citizen involvement in the process of government; of supporting and cooperation with fishery management agencies and educational institutions in development of good fisheries for the future; of encouraging youth involvement in sport fishery and leading the chapters in organizing and conducting youth participation activities; of promoting public awareness of the Federation's purposes, goals, and activities; of timely and efficient communications with the membership through a regular published newsletter; of gaining new members and new chapters to TBF and the Federation; to generate revenues sufficient to conduct the programs of the Federation; of reducing the hazards of boat operation and sport fishing; of supporting the non-profit purposes and goals of TBF; and other such goals as may be established for the chapters and the committees of the Federation.

We culminated the 2025 season with the TBF District 12 National Semifinal in Moundsville, WV on the Ohio River that saw 17 teams from Virginia compete for a chance to advance to the 2026 TBF National Championship on Pickwick Lake in Florence, Alabama, March 18-20. Brad Huddleston and Mark Elliot will join our Angler/Co-angler of the year Rick Mills and Chris Mills where they will compete for well over \$400,000 in cash and prizes. We kicked off the first tournament of the 2026 season with the East Regional October 25th on the Chickahominy River.

As we started the 2026 season we have some new awards. The Angler who catches the largest bass after all state tournaments are over will win a large Lunker of the year plaque along with a cash prize. The next new item is the Team that weighs in the smallest "5" fish limit at each tournament will win \$200.00.

That takes us to our 2026 season as you will see later the State Regional tournament schedule will fire back up on March 14th and will conclude with the National Semifinal the weekend of September 26-27th on Lake Anna. Coming up first for the Federation in 2026 is the Richmond Fishing Expo January 16th-18th. As usual we will have our large booth hosting the 2026 Virginia Reel Kids Casting State Championship. Along with this we will have our usual raffle table and merchandise table. It takes a lot of people for us to put on this event and we welcome any time you can volunteer to help. This is an important event for our Federation to showcase who we are and what we do. Many of our sponsors are also at this event and it gives you an opportunity to support them. As usual Les has a tremendous line up of Vendors and several of the Top Tier Professional Anglers there sharing their knowledge so come out and support this great show.

The board continues to work hard with existing sponsors and new ones. We have some of the best sponsors in the industry and they help us bring our Membership a very good tournament trail. 





Virginia Anglers Brad Huddleston, Mark Elliot, Rick Mills and Chris Mills will join TBF's top anglers from across the nation and Canada on Pickwick Lake, Alabama in mid-March for a weeklong tournament experience to decide the 2026 TBF National Championship. The TBF National Championship is a "no-entry-fee" tournament with a prize purse of over \$400,000. Following official practice days, the three days of competition will start with all eighty-five boaters and eighty-five co-anglers competing in the National Championship fishing the first two days of the event then the field is cut down to the 7 Division Champion boaters and 7 Division Champion co-anglers on the third and final day for the *Living Your Dream* Prize packages and the National Champion Boater and National Champion Co-Angler titles.


The TBF National Champion Boater and National Champion Co-angler both received a *Living Your Dream* package. The boater 2026 National Champion's prize package is valued in excess of a \$125,000 in cash and prizes including a brand-new fully rigged Nitro Z20XL. PLUS, a significant CASH prize, paid entry fee stipend into whatever tournament circuit they want to fish and much more! The National Champion Co-Angler prize package will be worth over \$30,000, including 20K cash PLUS paid entry stipends into the circuit of choice, and more. The top 14 finalists (Angler & Co Angler Division Champions) will also receive a "Living Your Dream" prize package of various sizes plus those anglers that maintained the optional Competitor Level MLF status advance to the BFL All American Championship.



October 25, 2025: James City County's Chickahominy Riverfront Park was the site for the first tournament of the 2026 Virginia Bass Chapter Federation Team Tournament Trail season. The East Regional Tournament was the first qualifying event for the 2026 State Championship to be held on back on the Chickahominy River next June 6th and 7th. The winning team from this event earned a berth on the State Team plus paid entries into the TBF National Semi-Final Tournament and the 2026 Team Tournament Trail two day State Championship. The Top 10% of the anglers from this event qualified for the 2026 TBF National Semi-Final Tournament to be held on Lake Anna in September. All participating anglers also earned valuable point towards the 2026 Virginia Angler of the Year and Co-Angler of the Year race.

It was a cool morning as teams arrived at Riverfront Park for tournament check-in and preparation for a safe light tournament blast-off.



The father and son team of Scott and Dylan Whitmore from the Nottoway Bass Masters topped the field with a five bass limit weighing in at 16.71 pounds. Another Nottoway Bass Masters team of Craig Cheek and Billy finished in 2nd Place with their limit weighing 16.00 pounds. In 3rd Place were the Nottoway Bassmasters Jamie Ratliff and Blaine Miller with 15.79 pounds. Blaine also weighed the tournaments Big Bass, a 6.40 pound largemouth. The 4th Place team with 15.26 pounds was the RVA Bassmasters team of Mike Coleman and Tracy Gravely. Finishing the tournament in the 5th spot was the father and son team of Marvin and Ben Major with 15.01 pounds.



The Virginia Bass Chapter Federation's "**TEAM TOURNAMENT TRAIL**" series serves as the Virginia TBF National Semi-Final (NSF) Qualifiers plus a **Virginia State Championship Team Tournament**. The series consists of 4 qualifying Team Tournaments held in each of 4 Regions (North, South, East, & West) throughout the state. Each qualifying tournament is a single day event. With this format Virginia TBF Anglers now have an opportunity to compete for bigger payouts and a Virginia State Team Championship while reducing their costs plus the benefit of fishing locally on familiar waters. All four regional tournaments are open to all Virginia TBF members in good standing. Teams that fish any of the 4 Regional events qualify for the 2 Day State Championship Team Tournament. The State Championship event has a 100% payback in cash and prizes with a Champions Package awarded to the winning team (cash, awards, apparel, paid TBF National Semi Final entry, etc.).

This is a TEAM TRAIL where anglers complete the registration as a pre-designated team. Launch order is determined by the order in which registrations are received. All Regional Tournaments are single day events. The 2 day State Championship Tournament is only open to those that fish a qualifying Regional Tournament. Those teams that win a qualifying Regional Tournament will receive free entry into the Championship Tournament. Teams that participate in 2 or more Regional Qualifying Tournaments in a season will have their registration fee reduced for the State Championship Tournament. The winning team from each of the four Regional Tournaments plus the top six teams (6 Anglers & 6 Co-Anglers) from the State Championship Team Tournament will make the **Virginia State Team**.

Virginia Angler & Co-Angler of the Year: Anglers will receive points for each Team Trail event they fish each season. The Angler and Co-Angler accumulating the most points from their best 4 out of 5 Team Trail Tournaments will be awarded the **Virginia Angler of the Year** and **Virginia Co-Angler of the Year**. Virginia's Angler and Co-Angler of the Year may bypass the National Semi Final event and advance directly into the TBF National Championship Tournament.

Teams have 3 options available for registration for the 4 Regional qualifying events.

1. Teams can download from the State Web Site (www.vabass.com), print, complete the registration, and mail the completed form with a check for payment. This method MUST be postmarked no later than 10 days prior to the event.
2. Teams also have the option to complete the registration and pay online through a link available on the State Web site (www.vabass.com). The online registration cutoff is midnight the Wednesday prior to the tournament.
3. If Teams do not register in time they may register at the tournament site the morning of the event. There will, however, be a \$25 administrative fee added to the tournament registration fee.

Registrations for the Virginia State Championship Team Tournament will be open by invitation to all qualifying teams.

NEW for 2026 !

In our continual efforts to improve our members tournament experience the Virginia Bass Chapter Federation State Board has approved the following additional awards starting with the first tournemnt of the 2026 Team Tournament Trail season, the East Regional on the Chickahominy River, October 25, 2025.

Team Tournament Trail “Smallest 5 Fish Limit” Award

At each Team Trail Regional tournament and the State Championship Tournament the team that weighs in the **“Smallest Five Fish Limit”** during each event will receive a \$200 payout. At least one member of the winning team must be present to receive the award. If not present the award will go to the next team present that meets the winning criteria.

Team Tournament Trail “Lunker of the Year” Award

The State Federation run Team Tournament Trail introduces the **“Lunker of the Year”** Award for the biggest bass weighed in during the tournament season (four Regional and State Championship Tournaments). The Team Tournament Trail “Lunker of the Year” winner will be awarded a plaque and \$100 at the conclusion of last tournament of each season (the State Championship Tournament). The winning angler must be a current Virginia Bass Chapter Federation member at the time of the award. For example: Each Team Trail season runs from October through the State Championship Tournament the following year. The winning angler must be a current member through the State Championship event.

Virginia Angler & Co-Angler Of the Year



The Virginia Angler of the Year and Co-Angler of the Year is an Angler Recognition Award that acknowledges the Angler and Co-Angler with the best overall performance each season and gives them the opportunity to advance directly into the TBF National Championship Tournament, bypassing the National Semi-Final qualifying tournament.

Team Trail Tournament anglers are awarded points for each Team Tournament Trail tournament that they participate in. At the end of each season the Angler of the Year and the Co-Angler of the Year will be awarded based upon the total points earned for their best 4 out of 5 Team Trail tournaments. The Virginia Angler of the Year and Co-Angler of the Year may bypass the National Semi-Final Tournament to advance directly into the TBF National Championship.

Here's how the points will be awarded: The system is a 200 point system with a +2 points for the tournament winners. The top points awarded will be 200 for the winning anglers (200 for the Angler and 200 for the Co-Angler). 2nd place anglers will receive 198 points, 3rd place anglers will receive 197 points, 4th place – 196 points, etc. Any anglers participating and not weighing fish will receive 100 points each. Each Angler and each Co-Angler points from their best 4 out of the 5 team Trail tournaments will be totaled and counted towards the Angler of the Year or Co-Angler of the Year Award.

The Angler of the Year and the Co-Angler of the Year will qualify to advance to the TBF National Championship and receive a prize package as determined by the State Board of Directors. To maintain their entry into the TBF National Championship Tournament both the winning Angler of the Year and the Co-Angler of the Year must commit to participate in the TBF National Championship event by December 1st each year. No substitute anglers are allowed. Therefore, if either the Angler of the Year or the Co-Angler of the Year declines to participate then neither angler can advance to the National Championship event. Once both anglers have committed to participate in the TBF National Championship Tournament, the State Federation will make the necessary arrangements with TBF, Inc. to secure their berth in the Championship event as Virginia's Angler and Co-Angler of the Year.

With the Angler & Co-Angler of the Year Award, each Team Trail participant can now compete for the opportunity to advance directly into the No-Entry-Fee TBF National Championship event as the Virginia Angler of the Year or Co-Angler of the Year.

The Virginia Bass Chapter Federation Team Tournament Trail format stays the same as in past years with 4 Regional Tournaments and a Team Trail State Championship Tournament.

A note from the VP:

With the onset of cold winter weather, most of us are looking at the prospect of putting our boats away and waiting for springtime. To make sure our boats are ready when spring weather arrives, we need to prepare our boats for the winter. Below are some tips for winter preparations we should all take to make sure your boat is protected and ready to hit the water when spring fishing season arrives.

First, drain the water from all your systems. I will generally run the bilge pump and livewell pumps to make sure there is no water in them. If you are in doubt, pour some quality RV anti freeze and run this through your systems. This will make sure all of the water has been removed. I also raise the front of the boat to make sure there is no trapped water anywhere in the hull. I then lower the bow of the boat and pour some of the RV anti freeze in the bilge and then raise it again and let the anti freeze drain.

Once these steps are done I lower the outboard motor to make sure all of the water remaining in the motor has drained. The next step would be to drain and refill the lower end oil to make sure there is no water or contaminants in the lower end. Then, I oil fog the cylinders to flush out any possible moisture and to protect the cylinders throughout the winter months. I leave the motor in the lowered position and cover the prop and water intakes with a strong plastic bag to prevent water or snow from entering any of these areas. Even if you plan on keeping your boat in a garage, I would still recommend taking these steps just to be safe.

Once the above steps are taken, be sure to remove all of your items such as electronics, life jackets, throw cushions and your rods, reels and tackle. Whether your boat is inside or outside, cover with a quality tight fitting boat cover or have your boat shrink wrapped to prevent water intrusion.

For those of you who continue to fish through the winter months, most of the above steps are not necessary. Just be sure to make sure your motor is drained of water and your plumbing systems are drained after each use.

Once these steps are done you should be able to rest easy. This will also give you the time to perform maintenance on your reels and sort your tackle and enjoys the winter season shows.



We continue to work closely with the Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources on issues concerning Invasive Species and Clean Drain Dry policy compliance. Another issue that keeps surfacing is compliance with the requirements for Tournament Permits when holding events at VA DWR ramps as well as those managed by the Corps of Engineers, State Parks, Municipalities, etc. As an organization we need to ensure we are taking the proper measures to secure required permits for the various tournaments locations across the state. At this time of year most of our Regions and Clubs are preparing their tournament schedules for the coming season. This tournament scheduling process should include the acquisition of any needed permits. Awareness and finding the right point of contact to obtain the needed permit can be a challenge as many of the permit requirements are not as openly advertised as they could be. I've been working through the various permit processes for many years in support of local Club and Region tournament schedules. In the following pages I have prepared a guide to assist in understanding the requirements and some of the processes to be taken when acquiring a tournament permit. The information we've included in the "Permit Guide" are primarily governing waters in the eastern and central parts of the State. We will work to expand the information provided over the next few editions of Tightlines. I'm sure there are likely additional requirements for the various bodies of water where our Clubs and Regions conduct tournaments. We welcome angler inputs to expand the informational guide. Once we complete we can post the document so it's available for reference for the entire Virginia Bass Fishing Community.

We promote the responsible harvest and consumption of spotted bass. I know that is a new position for a bass fishing community to take as we all have been advocates of the *Catch and Release* of any bass. However, the **Alabama Bass** has been designated as an **Invasive Species** here in Virginia and the VA DWR has removed creel limits for spotted bass in an effort to curb the spread of Alabama Bass. Responsible harvest represents a change in our way of thinking and along with that comes some educating on species identification. I recommend each of you pay particular attention to the "Know the Difference" graphic in this issue following the DWR Chief of Fisheries article. Make sure you know how to properly identify any spotted bass for intended harvest.

"CLEAN – DRAIN – DRY": Anglers are reminded that the unauthorized movement of fish/plants/aquatic life from one body of water to another jeopardizes the health of our fisheries and is illegal. Aside from the illegal movement of fish other measures have been enacted to help curb the spread of invasive species and nuisance plants/organisms with the implementation of **"CLEAN – DRAIN – DRY"** policies. Boaters are required by law to remove any vegetation from their boat/trailer and drain bilges when removing their vessel from the water. The regulation doesn't require that you immediately drain livewells if you are retaining your catch for weigh-in or harvest. However, unused livewells and baitwells should be drained on site. Regulations also require that reasonable measures should be taken to dry out bilges, livewells and baitwells prior to launching into another body of water.

Invasive Species Efforts --- What do you need to know?

ALABAMA BASS: The Alabama Bass Education, Identification, and Containment Project efforts continue with distributing the educational brochures and sampling packets throughout the State. Anglers are asked to report all suspected Alabama Bass catches from any body of water other than the Claytor Lake, Diascunds Reservoir, Kerr Lake, and Lake Gaston. The VA DWR Fisheries Management Team has put together a rapid response group that will investigate reported catches in an attempt to measure the extent of the Alabama Bass movement and make recommendations for future actions necessary to contain their spread. Anglers are encouraged to harvest all spotted bass caught.

Anglers are reminded that it is illegal to stock fish into a public body of water without an authorization from Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources (DWR). Anyone with knowledge of intentional stockings of Alabama Bass or any other species should contact DWR law enforcement at 800-237-5712 or WildCrime@dwr.virginia.gov.

The Reporting Process - If you catch a suspected Alabama Bass:


1. Take a picture of the fish.
2. Clip off a thumbnail-sized portion of one of the pelvic fins (pelvic fins are located on the bottom of the fish, just under the head.)
3. Store the fin clip dry in an envelope.
4. Email picture to: fisheries@dwr.virginia.gov for verification with name of angler, location caught, date caught, & phone number.
5. Mail the fin sample collected to the address provided when requested.

NORTHERN SNAKEHEADS: Anglers are reminded that it is illegal to possess a live snakehead in Virginia. Anglers are encouraged to kill and report any snakeheads they encounter. In an effort to track Snakehead migration VA DWR has established a **SNAKEHEAD HOTLINE** that anglers can use to report snakehead fish: **(804-367-2925)** Take a picture of the fish, report the angler's last name, date of catch, location of catch, and size.

Anglers are required to report snakeheads if caught. Snakeheads must be dead if in possession (contained in live well, cooler, etc.). The DWR asks that all snakeheads be killed if possible. If an angler wishes to keep a legally caught northern snakehead, the fish must be killed to be in possession.

Fishing Tournament

Permit Guide

Virginia DWR, North Carolina WRC, The Army Corp of Engineers and many local jurisdictions require a permit to hold a Fishing Tournament at one of their boat ramps or Parks. The permit process varies significantly by agency which can be somewhat confusing and frustrating to navigate. The next few pages can be used as your resource for obtaining your required permit when scheduling a fishing tournament at one of their facilities. Club Presidents, Region Directors and Tournament Directors need to research your local jurisdictions to insure the required permits are obtained for each event.

VIRGINIA: The **Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources (DWR)** requires a **Special Use Permit** for fishing tournaments/rodeos/derby's/etc. utilizing any VA DWR owned boat ramp or facilities. Special Use Authorization Application is available online at: <https://dwr.virginia.gov/forms-download/PERM/PERM-005.pdf> . Applications need to be submitted a minimum of 30 days prior to the date requested but no more than 60 days prior to the requested date. Completed applications are to be submitted to:

The Go Outdoors Virginia mobile application is an excellent resource for identifying and the locations of DWR ramps and boating access areas. You can download the application at: <https://dwr.virginia.gov/app/>

HENRICO COUNTY: Many clubs and regions use Osborne Landing on the James River for their tournaments. In addition to the VA DWR permit requirement for utilizing the DWR owned ramp **Henrico County Division of Recreation and Parks** also requires a **Park Event Permit for Osborne Landing Park**. The application process is accomplished by completing submitting the online request available at: <https://henrico.gov/services/apply-for-a-park-event-permit/> . As part of the application process you are required to provide a Certificate of Insurance showing coverage for at least \$1,000,000 for each occurrence. TBF Clubs/Regions can request a Certificate of insurance for their tournament online from TBF at: <https://www.bassfederation.com/insurance-certificate-request-form/>. TBF requests that you allow 14 business days for processing. The Certificate of Insurance will be emailed to the individual making the request.

Note that VA DWR will not issue their Special Use Permit for Osborne Landing Ramp until you have obtained and provided them a copy of the required Henrico County Park Use permit.

Once you have submitted your Henrico County request and obtained your Certificate of Insurance from TBF you need to forward the certificate to the Henrico County parks Special Events Division. The Henrico County Parks point of Contact is:

North Carolina: North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission has an online application portal to apply for a permit to utilize one of their ramp facilities for your tournament. The online application is available at: <https://www.ncwildlife.gov/boating/boating-access-area-event-permits>.

Kerr Lake: Permits are required for ALL tournaments regardless of size. The Army Corps of Engineers permit request forms can be obtained at: <https://www.saw.usace.army.mil/Locations/District-Lakes-and-Dams/John-H-Kerr-1/Special-Events/>

Lake Gaston: Lake Gaston tournament permits are required when using any North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission owned ramp or Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources (DWR) owned ramp. Permits can be obtained through the processes for the appropriate **Virginia** or **North Carolina** agency.

Lake Gaston's **Holly Grove Marina** is a popular spot for Region and Club tournaments. You can call the marina store, (434)636-3455, to reserve the ramp for your tournament.

Leesylvania State Park: Leesylvania State Park is a popular location for Potomac River Tournaments. There is a Special Use permit process for fishing tournaments. Special use permits require a \$25 processing fee and take at least 30 days to process. It may prove impossible to process requests made fewer than 30 days in advance in time. Special use permits can be obtained by calling the park office directly at 703-730-8205, emailing: Leesylvania@dcr.virginia.gov or by visiting the park office in person.

Pamunkey River: Williams Landing is a privately owned ramp and is the popular location for Pamunkey River tournaments. Google shows the address for Williams Landing as: 6632 Putneys Mill Rd., New Kent, VA 23124. Clubs can book the use of the ramp by contacting Ryland at (804)971-1646. Ramp fees are paid at the drop box by the ramp.





James City County Tournament Facilities - Permits

James City County Parks and Recreation welcomes local, regional, and national fishing tournaments at Chickahominy Riverfront Park and Little Creek Reservoir Park. A **Fishing Tournament Permit** is required for any tournament of 20 boats or larger. Chickahominy Riverfront Park (CRP) can accommodate larger tournaments of up to 100 boats. Little Creek Reservoir Park can accommodate smaller tournaments. Unfortunately, fishing tournaments are not allowed to launch from Brickyard Landing Park.

Optional amenities at CRP include a dedicated tournament weigh-in area, field/fishing pier rental (exclusive), and the option to conduct weigh-in activity in the boat trailer parking area (limited to a 72"x30" table or truck bed for weigh-in).

The unique amenity at CRP is the dedicated Tournament Weigh-In Site. The site can be rented for \$30/day and includes power access at the old camping site #111. The site must be rented in order to have access to the fish release pipe. To use the pipe, you must pump water to the head of the pipe from Gordon's Creek and maintain sufficient water flow during fish release (user must supply their own submersible pump). Additional instructions are posted on site.



James City County Fishing Tournament Permit Process

1. A permit is required for ALL Tournaments of 20 Boats or more. The Permit Application is completed through the JCC PermitLink System <https://jamecitycountyva-energovweb.tylerhost.net/apps/selfservice#/home>
2. There is a \$25 permit processing fee (it is recommended that if you are having multiple tournaments during the year at the same location that you put all the dates on a single application).
3. There is a \$250 refundable security deposit required when processing the permit(s).
4. A Certificate of Insurance showing \$1M liability coverage with James City County shown as the additional insured is required for each event at least 30 days prior to the tournament.
5. Prior to the tournament the JCC Facility Coordinator (permit office) will email the Tournament Organizer a James City County Dated Ramp Pass that you can reproduce as needed for your tournament.
6. Tournament Organizer is REQUIRED to collect ALL ramp fees for your participants and make payment at the park office by noon of the tournament day (\$8 Non-James City County residents, \$5 for county residents, waived for annual pass holders and campers).
7. The Tournament Organizer is required to check-in with the Park Coordinator or Guest Services no later than 30 days prior to the event.
8. The County will issue permits for multiple tournaments or park activities on any given day up to the limit of available parking. Tournament Organizers are encouraged to coordinate launch and weigh-in times/locations for their tournaments to minimize congestion during launch and recovery at the ramp area.
9. No parking is allowed at any time on the roadway in front of the weigh-in site. All vehicles and trailers must be parked in the designated parking area in the field. If the weigh-in site is rented, it is the responsibility of the tournament director to manage its access, use, and cleanup.



Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources

Greetings TBF Anglers,

Virginia is home to five different species of bass – the northern largemouth, the Florida, the smallmouth, the spotted, and the Alabama. All but the Alabama bass are native to some portion of the state.

The northern largemouth is native to the southwestern portion of the state and is what we think about when we mention largemouth. The Florida bass is native to Back Bay and coastal points south. Most of our bass populations are hybrids of these two species, and right now, we probably do not have any pure northern largemouth or Florida bass left. This is because we've moved around a lot of fish. In fact, we did not know until very recently that Back Bay historically supported Florida bass – genetic testing to assess F1 stocking clued us in. This was an interesting finding, as for years we thought bass were not native to Back Bay and connected rivers.

Smallmouth bass are native to southwest Virginia and found throughout the Commonwealth. Our smallmouth is the northern smallmouth – for reference, there is a Neosho smallmouth out in Oklahoma and Arkansas. As we ramp up smallmouth bass production (we stocked more than 200k smallmouth this past year) at our Front Royal fish hatchery, we're doing genetic testing to track who the parents are and ultimately, how much they contribute to the population. Right now, we're experimenting with breeders from Lake Moomaw and the Shenandoah River. Stay tuned.

Spotted bass, what we all refer to as Kentuckys, are native to the southwestern portion of the state. They've been moved all over the place and many of our rivers, such as the Appomattox and the Pamunkey, have abundant spotted bass populations. They max out at about two pounds and are willing biters most of the time. They look nearly identical to Alabama bass, and until recently, scientists didn't realize that they were different species.

Alabama bass are the bass that were historically the big spotted bass – think Lake Lanier and Lake Berryessa. In fact, we first realized we had Alabama bass in Virginia because of genetic testing. There was a large spotted bass entered for state record consideration, and we tested its genetics. Well, it turns out that the fish was an Alabama. We did a lot of follow up testing and found Alabama bass in several of our reservoirs and determined they were introduced by anglers about 2009. Those introductions have had consequences – Gaston is chock full of little Alabamas and Philpott's smallmouth population is in the process of being swamped by hybridization. These negative impacts are why we consider them an invasive species.

If you'd like more specific info on where and how to compile a life list of all five species, please reach out and I'll connect you with a biologist.





Alabama bass (invasive)



Largemouth bass



- Anglers are reminded that the introduction of novel predators can have unforeseen impacts on native or established ecosystems.
- The introduction of Alabama bass is illegal in Virginia. Alabama bass have been scientifically shown to out-compete established populations of largemouth bass and hybridize with small-mouth bass.
- Invasive species cause negative ecological and/or economic harm.
- Anglers who suspect they have captured an Alabama bass should take a picture of the fish, clip off a thumbnail-sized portion of one of the pelvic fins, and store the fin clip dry in an envelope. The pelvic fins are located on the bottom of the fish, just under the head. They should then either contact the Department of Wildlife Resources at: fisheries@dwr.virginia.gov or 804-367-1293.

Virginia Youth Anglers Compete at State Federation Region Tournaments

Under the new format for Virginia Youth Anglers, teams are allowed to participate in State Federation Region Tournaments and earn points towards a State Youth Team of the Year Title. Youth Teams enter (no entry fee), launch, and weigh-in with the adults during Region Tournaments. Teams are awarded points based upon the number of Youth teams competing in the event and their finishing place among youth teams. Points for the youth teams from throughout the state will be compiled and their top 3 point earning events will be tallied to determine the Virginia Youth Team of the Year. Each year the Youth teams from throughout the state will gather for a tournament and head to head competition to determine who will represent Virginia at the TBF Junior World Championship Tournament.

Virginia High School Angling Teams are also invited to compete at State Federation Region Tournaments to earn points towards a Virginia High School Team of the Year title. The High School Anglers also compete in the Student Angler Federation events and the SAF hosted State High School Championship Tournament each year.

Youth Anglers must be a member of an active TBF Junior Club or the Student Angler Federation (SAF). Each Youth Angler Team must arrange for their own boat and boat captain and complete the required Emergency Medical Information Event and Liability/Parental Consent forms. Youth Teams will launch and weigh-in with the host tournament anglers and earn valuable points towards the Virginia TBF Junior Angler or High School State Championship title.

Tony Huddleston Memorial Trout Fishing Rodeo

The 10th Annual Tony L. Huddleston Trout Rodeo took place on Saturday, October 4, 2025, at Izaak Walton Park in Christiansburg, marking the most successful event in its history. A record 120 participants turned out for a morning of fishing, fun, and community partnership.



Support from local organizations helped elevate this year's rodeo. TBF Virginia Bass Chapter Federation Region 4 hosted the Reel Kids Casting Skills Competition, while Region 8 supplied 25 fishing rods for children without their own gear. The Department of Wildlife Resources was on-site to engage and educate young anglers and a new addition—Montgomery County 4-H—offered an archery activity that quickly became a crowd favorite. These partnerships continue to play a vital role in shaping positive outdoor experiences for the next generation.



The Reel Kids Casting Skills Competition winners, Parker King (age group 7-11) and Niniola Kaka (age group 12-15) qualified for the state championship that will be held at the Richmond Fishing Expo in Doswell Virginia on Saturday, January 17th.

The event honors the memory of Tony Huddleston, a dedicated Christiansburg Parks and Recreation employee who served as a facility supervisor, sports official, and multi-sport youth coach. Beyond his work with the department, Tony founded the Junior Legion baseball program and was widely known as a mentor whose impact reached countless young people. He tragically passed away as the result of a fishing accident, and this event serves as a lasting tribute to his legacy.



Each participant was permitted to catch up to four fish during the two-hour event. Awards were presented to the top anglers in each age group: Riley Daigneault (age group 4-6), Wyatt Compton (age group 7-9), Colton Sult (age group 10-12) and Bradley Brumfield (age group 13-15).

Additional plaques and tackle boxes were awarded for the largest and smallest fish overall. Every participant received an event T-shirt, a giveaway ticket, and a free lunch. More than \$2,000 in prizes was distributed, all donated by generous local businesses. A parent raffle also helped raise funds to kick-start planning for the 2026 rodeo.







Region 8 Members Appreciation Tournament




Chickahominy River, November 2, 2025
